Who We Help

Hospice is open to anyone of any age with a life-limiting illness, with a prognosis of 6 months or less should the disease follow its natural course. Some of these illnesses include:

- Cancer
- · End-Stage Cardiovascular Disease
- Congestive Heart Failure
- Stroke
- · Parkinson's
- Multiple Sclerosis
- · ALS
- · Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
- End-Stage Renal Disease
- · Liver Disease

Persons who are experiencing serious multi-symptom decline (often known as "failure to thrive"), repeated emergency room visits and/or hospitalizations, or discontinuing aggressive treatment may also be eligible for hospice care. It is not necessary to be homebound to receive hospice care.

Eligibility for hospice care must be certified by a doctor. Persons may cease hospice care at any time. If their condition improves, they can be discharged from hospice care and returned to regular medical treatment, with the option to return to hospice whenever they choose.

How We Help

Infinity Care focuses on alleviating the pain and symptoms associated with life-limiting illnesses through a combination of medications, therapies, and counseling. We work as a team with each patient's physician to create a personalized care plan.
